STAYING ON LUNDY

Lundy offers visitors an extraordinary range of buildings in which to stay, from a 13th century Castle, a Georgian Villa to a Lighthouse and Fisherman's
Chaler. Most of the buildings are constructed from the Island's beautiful light coloured granite and may have been adapted from previous uses. There are
23 self-catering holiday properties available and also a campsite.
From April to the end of October is when our handsome passenger and supply vessel MS Oldenburg carries staying visitors from Bideford or Ilfracombe.
Winter breaks are available from November until the end of March. A Helicopter Service operating from Hartland Point on Mondays and Fridays at
11.00 am allows visitors to reach the Island in time for lunch and is perfect for a short "getaway from it all" break.
Period return Helicopter ticket: Adult £116.00, Child under 16 £62.00, Infants under 2 £14.00.
Period return Sailing ticket: Adult £65.00, Child under 16 £33.00, Infants under 4 £13.00.

When people see an island in the distance, they usually want to land on it. What can they find on Lundy Island? A place of outstanding natural beauty. Skies full of birds. Pirate haunts. Air like wine. A medieval castle. Seals. Special Lundy stamps. Three lighthouses. Black



rabbits. Rocks like great cheeses. Undersea marvels. Climbers' cliffs. Cannons. Peace and quiet. Lundy ponies. Standing stones. Wildlife. A smugglers' cave. Earthquake cracks. And the lovable puffin. 'Lund-ey' is Norse for puffin island.



This remote island is a natural fortress, with a tempestuous history as a pirate lair. It became prosperous and respectable in the last century, even gaining a church. The dramatic Old Lighthouse, the 13th century castle and other fascinating buildings now provide holiday accommodation. Arrange to stay for a short break or a longer visit for an unforgettable experience.



The Marisco Tavern is the heart of the island – a place of friendliness, fine food and perpetual shelter. Sample local ales while you drink in the atmosphere. Lundy Island is the site of 137 shipwrecks, and the evidence of a dramatic past is all around. Close by is the Lundy shop, where you can buy anything from souvenirs to provisions for your picnic.

LUNDY ISLAND

Three miles long and half a mile wide, Lundy lies 10 miles off the coast of North Devon where the Atlantic meets the Bristol Channel.



A day trip to Lundy Island is also a cruise, a chance to enjoy the beautiful North Devon coast. Lundy's own ship, the MS Oldenburg, is a sizeable vessel, carrying 267 passengers, and providing bar, buffet, shop and information centre. Fascinating island guides and leaflets are available to help you explore. From either Bideford or Ilfracombe, the voyage takes under 2 hours. Landing on the jetty, you walk up the cliff road from the beach, and the island awaits.

Lundy maps don't mark viewpoints. The entire coast is spectacular. For the most breathtaking landscape, go from the church to the island's west side. You walk on flat springy turf, but still see dramatic sights. The track, on from the village street, leads to the central plateau. Wear trainers, walking shoes or boots for comfort and safety. Walk round the south end for solitude, along the east side for its plants.

Children love the farm. Sheep which were once bottle fed see people as friends. All domestic animals are free range, and visitors can wander at will, so long as gates are shut. Everyone can find a favourite amongst the chickens, ducks, lambs and ponies.
